WHERE

Intercity passenger rail service will connect travelers across Colorado's Front Range with stations in Fort Collins, Loveland, Longmont, Boulder, Denver, Littleton, Castle Rock, Colorado Springs and Pueblo.



WHY

By 2050, an additional 3 million people are expected to live and commute along Colorado's Front Range. Front Range Passenger Rail will provide a relaxed and efficient transportation option, increasing accessibility to housing, employment opportunities and key destinations.



WHEN

The Front Range Passenger Rail District (District) is modeling service frequency, infrastructure, operation costs and financing needs. Daily passenger rail service is expected to launch within the decade.



HOW

The Colorado Legislature created the District to construct and operate a passenger rail system and form track-sharing partnerships that will help expedite the service start date.
